Subject Overview	:

Community Development Subjects equip students with the skills and knowledge necessary for various positions in community development at the local level. The course units emphasize functional abilities for society. Students will contribute to strengthening local communities by enhancing their capacity and becoming advocates for change. Additionally, students will profit from studying in the village alongside the community and collaborating with partners. This combination of knowledge and experience will prepare students for working life.

Course Objectives :

At the completion of this course, students are expected to:

1. Demonstrate an understanding of the processes of functional abilities for society.
2. Show what the sources are of continuity and change in community development.
3. Demonstrate an appreciation of development in society.
4. Show an understanding of community development challenges facing related to international communication.

Course Method :

The course consists of lectures, presentations, assignments, and project realization. It is expected that every student will regularly attend classes and participate in class discussion. Real world and fictitious case studies provided by the lecturer will be discussed. Students will contribute to strengthening local communities by enhancing their capacity and becoming advocates for change. Additionally, students will profit from studying in the village alongside the community and collaborating with partners. This combination of knowledge and experience will prepare students for working life.
