Subject Specification	: General Fundamentals Course

Subject Overview : This subject is adopted from the CEFR, level A1 (introductory or discovery). Level A1 is the most basic level of personal language use. At level A1, the learner is capable of simple interaction. Students are expected to answer and ask simple questions about him/herself, the place where he/she lives, the people he/she knows, and the things he/she has. The A1 learner can intervene with simple statements in areas that concern or are familiar to him/her and respond to them as well, not just repeating ready-made, pre-organized expressions.

This subject also encourages the students to exercise four aspects of learning French: listening, reading, writing, and speaking. It is really important when the student would like to take the international French exam in the future, namely DELF (*Diplôme d'Etudes en Langue Française*) A1, which is an official qualification awarded by the French Ministry of Education to certify the competency of candidates from outside France in the French language. The students are already used to performing in four aspects of learning French.

The learning method of this course is a combination of several Teaching-Learning Methods, such as the lecture method (one-way), class discussion (two-way), and student-centered learning (students learn how to make collaborate, cooperate, and discussion about problem-solving with their classmates). The method to be used in online learning with a total of 14 meetings.

Course Objectives :

At the completion of this course, students are expected to:

1. Understands and uses common everyday expressions and very simple words aimed at meeting specific requirements.
2. Can introduce him/herselves and others and can ask and answer questions about personal details such as where he/she lives, people he/she knows and things he/she has.
3. Can communicate in a simple way if the other person speaks slowly and clearly and is cooperative.
4. Can describe their work, their family and their environment.
5. Can talk about their preference in hobbies, foods, and films.
6. Can write a short email or a postcard.

Course Method : The course will be conducted through interactive learning, it will consist of class discussion, students presentation, quiz, case study analysis , paper, assignment and exams.discussed.

Learning Outcome (Competence) :

- Knowledge : Alphabet and pronunciation, grammar basics, common phrases and expressions, sentence structure, reading and writing
- Skill : Basic vocabulary, pronunciation, cultural understanding, use language learning resources, listening and speaking practices

- Attitude : Curiosity, patience, persistence, openness to feedback, confidence
